Operative Clauses

- I. 1 OC = 1 measure
- II. Necessary:
 - I. Starting Phrase
 - II. Sub-clauses possible
- III. Ideas:
 - I. Individually for each topic
 - I. What are the problems & relevant solutions
 - II. How can they be continued, added or changed?
 - II. Sub bodies
 - III. Reporting
 - IV. Conferences/meetings of participating parties
 - V. Collaboration
 - VI. Funding



Operative Clauses

- “ 1. Encourages member states to work in conjunction with the UNSTDP and the FTA to start campaigns and programs throughout their countries that promote and encourage the use of public transport by:
- a) Making sure the public transportation is as cheap and as accessible as possible,
 - b) informing people about the advantages of public transport and how it also provides environmental benefits,
 - c) making sure the transition point between different transport systems are as smooth and efficient as possible,
 - d) getting into contact with local businesses to start operating in the renewed stations in order to:
 - i. attract the public mass towards using public transport,
 - ii. provide places to the public where they can eat, drink, rest etc.,
 - iii. encourage the tourism sector into increasing their usage of the new or already existing public transport methods; “



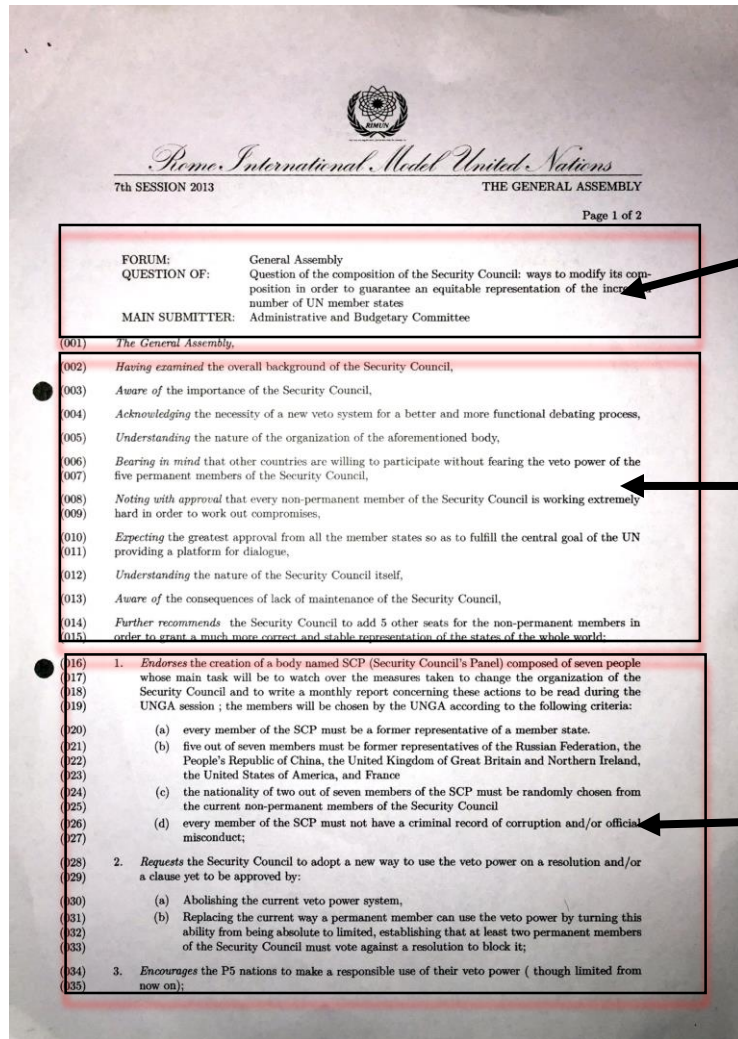
Operative Clauses

TIPS

- As specific as possible
- Prevent accusing other countries or organizations
- No OCs against religious beliefs
- No OCs which go against the UN Charter or United Nations Declaration of Human Rights

Bevor getting started

- I. Decide which points you want to tackle
- II. Focus?

Also keep in mind

- I. Abbreviations need to be listed once (*...to the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR)...*)
- II. Your enemies' interests



Resolution

Checklist

I. Content

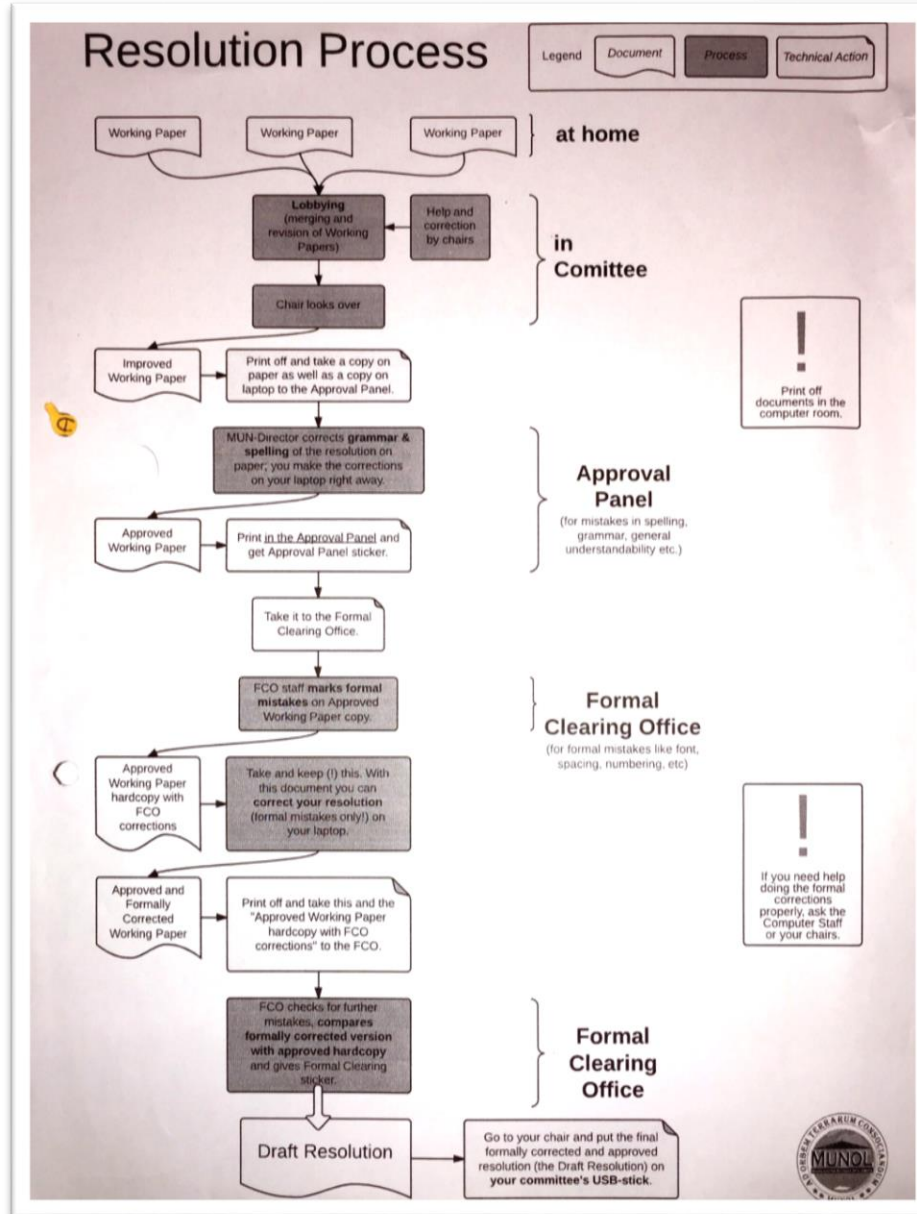
- ✓ Any clause against the UN Charter?
- ✓ Powerful words ("urges", etc.) should be avoided
- ✓ When dealing with budgetary → Only suggestive words
- ✓ Only sub bodies can be established – other Organizations not linked to the UN cannot be set up

II. General

- ✓ Format: Stick to the format?
- ✓ Spelling: Check briefly for spelling mistakes
