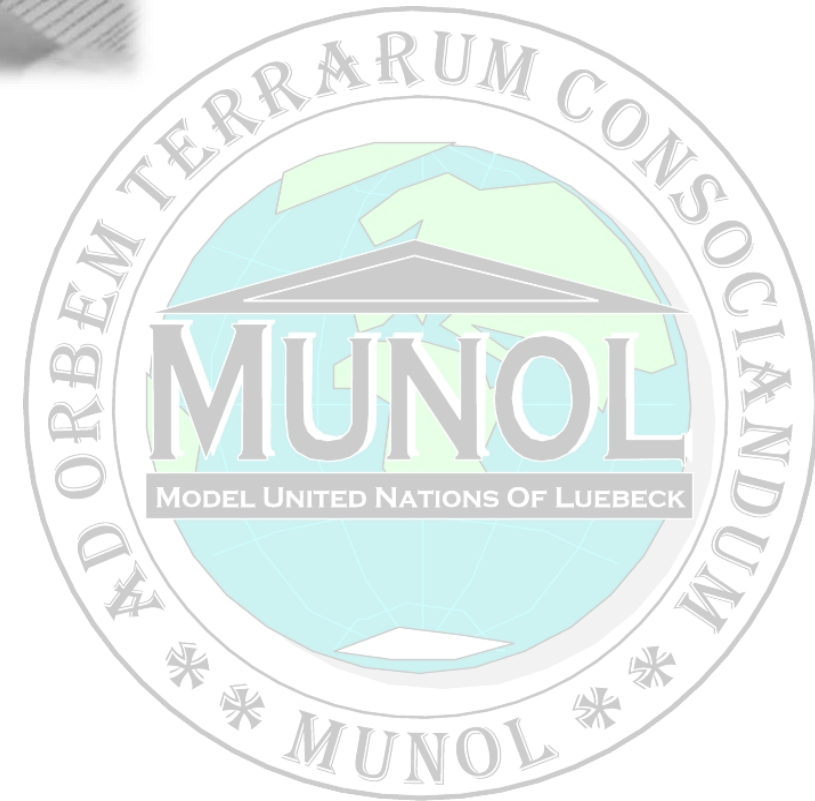
United Nations

 - Define important terms

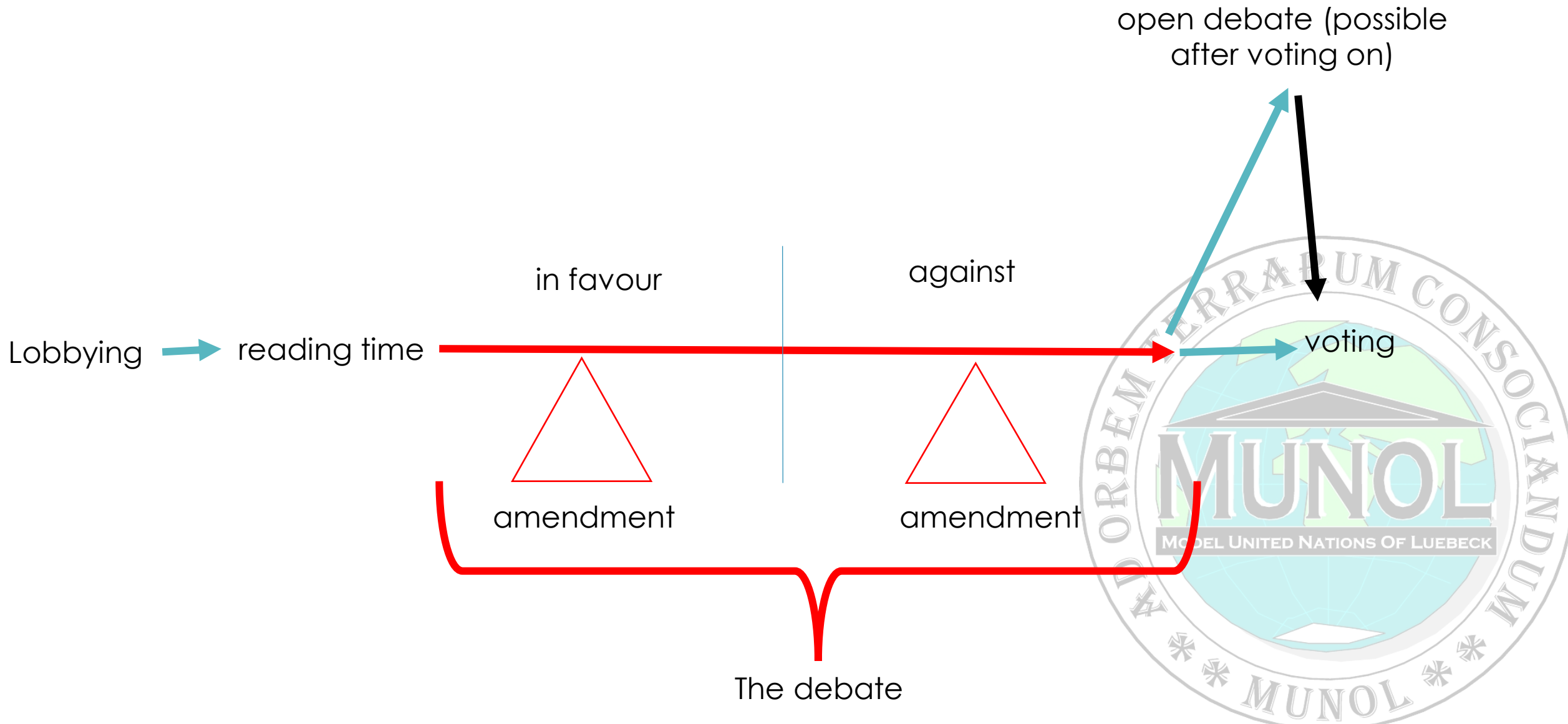

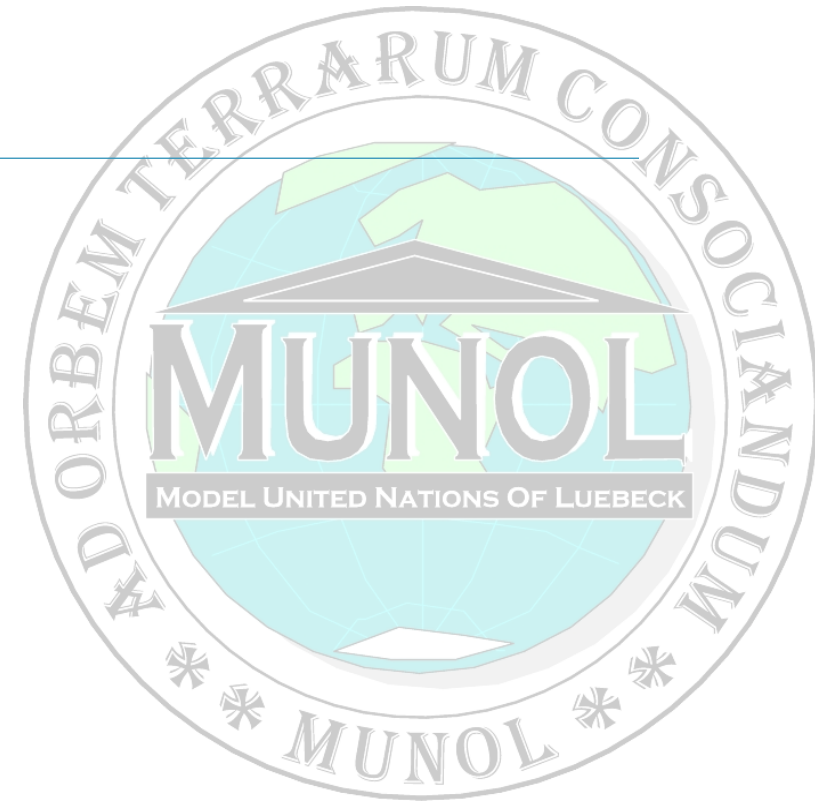
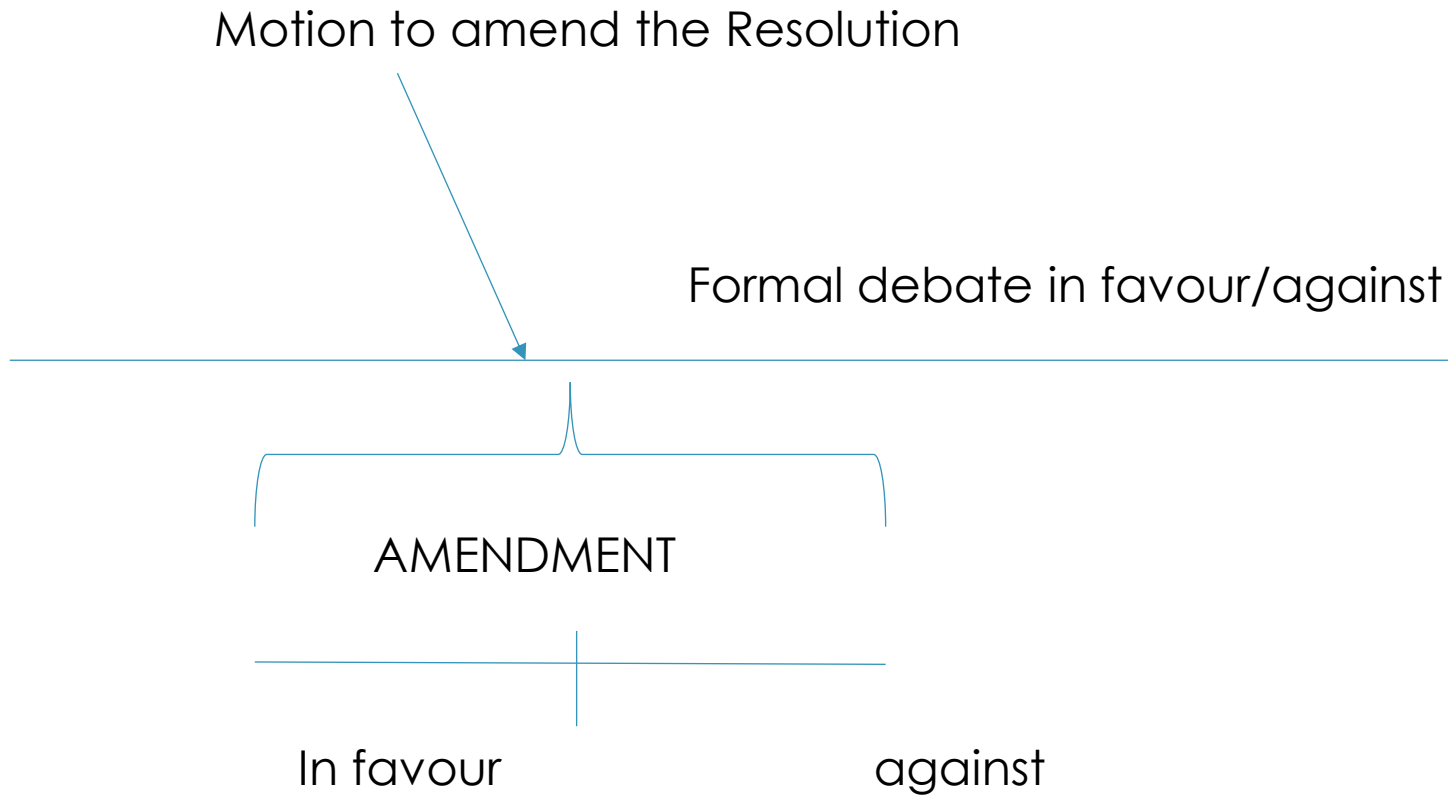

FORUM:	First Committee
QUESTION OF:	Decreasing the import of weapons in South Sudan
SPONSOR:	Ukraine
CO-SPONSORS:	Republic of the Sudan, United Arab Emirates
THE FIRST COMMITTEE,	
<i>Concerned</i> about the current situation in South Sudan due to the ongoing civil war,	
<i>Recognizing</i> the need of military facilities for the South Sudanese government,	
<i>Noting further</i> that oil companies such as Royal Dutch Shell are being punished for providing military facilities to the Republic of South Sudan,	
<i>Fearing</i> that South Sudan will lose the protection of their most important economic infrastructure and their full governing power during the war,	
<i>Emphasizing</i> the need for a stable the government in the Republic of South Sudan,	
1.	<u>Encourages</u> states and companies to: - Provide the government of the Republic of South Sudan with military facilities in order to ensure peace and protect the South Sudanese people and provide transparency in their military spending, - Make sure, companies working in the oil industry do not get punished by operating in South Sudan in order to support the local economy;
2.	<u>Invites</u> international peace organisations to: Punish companies and states providing weapons to rebel groups who are against the political system in South Sudan;
3.	<u>Further considers</u> the government of the Republic of South Sudan views Sudanese military operation as illegal in the territory of South Sudan;
4.	<u>Proposes</u> to minimize illegal acquisition of arms by: - Punishing shell companies, - Listing arm brokers in a central register in order to reduce the amount of weapons the terrorists in South Sudan have access to;
5.	<u>Recalls</u> all existing embargos against the government of the Republic of South Sudan.

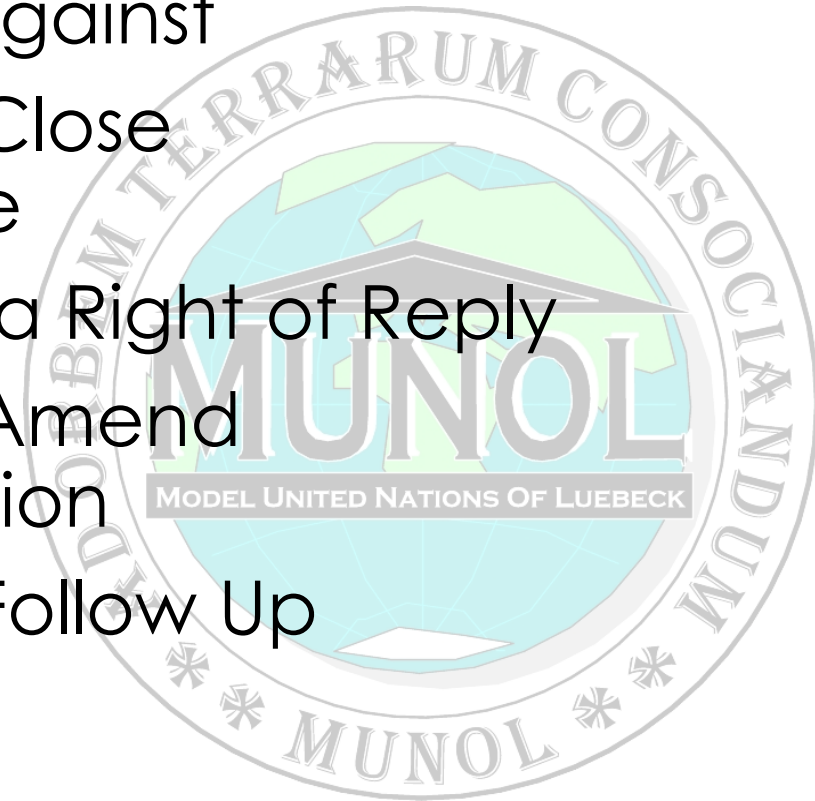
Points and Motions

Motions (most important)

- Motion to Move into Time Against
- Motion to Close the Debate
- Motion for a Right of Reply
- Motion to Amend the Resolution
- Motion to Follow Up
